
CIVITAS City Declaration

The CIVITAS Initiative, launched by the European Commission in the year 2002, supports ambitious European cities to introduce and test ambitious and innovative measures that foster sustainable urban mobility. In order to achieve their objectives, the cities implement an integrated set of measures that are selected specifically to match local circumstances.

We, elected political local representatives of the local authority wishing to join the CIVITAS network as a member city, hereby declare our commitment to:

- **Introduce** an ambitious sustainable urban mobility policy, integrating innovative measures, technologies and infrastructure.
- **Support** and **contribute** to the achievement of the aims of the CIVITAS Initiative.
- **Share our experiences** and learn about other cities' progress and achievements by participating in the CIVITAS network and community.

We aim to:

- **Achieve** a significant increase in the modal split of sustainable transport modes.
- **Increase** active and shared mobility.
- **Work** in partnerships with others to develop and implement our sustainable urban mobility policies.
- **Follow an integrated approach** by addressing as many as possible of the categories of CIVITAS instruments and measures in our policy:

Instruments and measures to develop a more sustainable urban transport system:

- Cleaner vehicles and alternative fuels, both in public fleets and among private users.
- [Mobility management](#) to stimulate behaviour change and sustainable urban planning.
- An integrated approach to urban transport pricing and ticketing.

Instruments and measures to make better use of existing road infrastructure:

- Reallocating urban space and restricting access to (polluting) private motor vehicles.
- Intelligent transport management and information systems (ITS).
- Zero-emission urban logistics.

Instruments and measures to promote the use of alternative transport modes:

- High-quality public transport.
- Promotion of walking and cycling (active mobility).
- Use of mobility management and raising awareness of sustainable mobility's benefits.

I recognise that active participation in the CIVITAS community includes:

- Attendance by a city representative in the CIVITAS Forum conferences,
- A constructive and proactive approach in disseminating information about the CIVITAS Initiative at a local and national level,
- Submitting a paper with background information on our city and its mobility policy, which will also include how the categories of CIVITAS instruments and measures will be implemented and integrated into our city.
